All campers will have an opportunity to earn three to four merit badges and to spend every afternoon doing their favorite things. If you like boats, climbing, rifles, bows, bikes, canoes, fires, fishing and more, you're going to love this place. Our program aims for high intensity fun and accomplishment. But there's a lot more to choose from:

Browsea - Designed for new Scouts attending Boy Scout resident camp for the first time. Scouts will learn outdoor skills needed for Tenderfoot, Second Class, First Class ranks such as fire building, cooking, map and compass, first aid, camp-site set up, and earn at least one merit badge. A highly qualified and really cool staff member works to ensure the Scout has the best week of his life.

Island Venture - A unique program for Scouts 14 or older. Scouts who participate will be given a "menu" of activities from which to choose. The program will be decided entirely by the Scouts. There are three merit badges associated with the program, Citizenship in the Nation, Personal Fitness and Public Speaking. Scouts will have the option to choose one of these merit badges to work on during the week. Some possible activities that will be available are tomahawk throwing, canoe/kayak trip, low COPE course, climbing, a day at the beach and a trip to the shotgun range.

Early Morning Program - Every morning at 6:30 AM you can choose an exciting activity to do before breakfast. Archery, climbing, rappelling, swimming, fishing and cooking are just some of the activities from which to choose.

Kayaking BSA - Scouts will be trained in techniques of sea kayaking by a skilled instructor. Limited to eight scouts in each session. Scouts completing this program will earn the Kayaking BSA patch.

BSA Lifeguard - This award is the highest award offered by the BSA for aquatic skills. Participants will be trained in all areas of aquatic safety and management, including both water and land rescues. Participants must attend the CPR course and pass a written exam. In order to be considered for certification, participants must have at least 30 hours under the direct supervision of the Aquatics Director.

Low COPE - COPE is an acronym for Challenging Outdoor Personal Experience. The course consists of a series of outdoor challenges, progressing from basic group initiative games to more complicated low-course activities. Participants climb, balance, and jump as well as think through solutions to a variety of challenges. Objectives include building teams, solving problems, making decisions, and developing trust, communication, leadership, planning and self-esteem as team members cooperate to achieve goals.

Black Powder - A black powder class is available for those 13 and over who want to experience the thrill and challenge of loading and firing rifles from a bygone era.

Provisional Camp - A Scout may attend camp at Baiting Hollow this summer even if his troop is not camping. Be part of our Provisional Troop where the camp provides the adult leadership. A Scout may attend by himself, or with his patrol and will have the opportunity to do all of the programs that a troop would do. Provisional camping also allows Scouts to return for more than one week of camp during the summer. Provisional camp is offered for five weeks during summer camp. *(There is a discount of \$25.00 each week you attend after the first week.)*

Bridge Camp - Bridge camp is a provisional program for Scouts who have just bridged over from Webelos. During the day the Scout will be involved with our Brownsea “first year camper program.” At night he will be in a campsite with other Scouts his age. He will have a chance to work on Totin Chip, Fireman Chit, Baiting Hollow Naturalist and participate in all of the other camp programs. Additionally, he will have the opportunity to work on his first merit badge.

Boy Scout Day Camp - This program runs for nine weeks. It is designed for Boy Scouts who want the excitement of the camp experience but can't spend the night at camp due to other commitments. Scouts will be formed into patrols and will have the opportunity to work on one merit badge each week. Swimming, boating, climbing, archery, and crafts are just some of the activities in store for the Scouts.

Counselor in Training - A Scout may enroll as a CIT if he is at least 14 years old by July 1, 2012. Half his day will be spent working next to experienced staff members getting a hands-on look at the camp's programs. The second half of the day will be spent on individual advancement and achievements including an opportunity to work on merit badges. Individuals who graduate from the CIT program will then have the opportunity to be considered for placement as a member of our Junior Staff Intern Program. If selected, Scouts can continue their training at no cost and spend the remainder of the summer working with our camp staff.

Eagle Camp - For Scouts who are at least First Class, 13 years old and need help with some of their Eagle required merit badges, our **Trail to Eagle Camp** is just the thing. During the week, counselors will be available for all the Eagle required merit badges. Some badges require 3 months worth of work and have requirements that must be completed and worked on before arriving at camp. **PLAN EARLY**. One of the highlights of the week is the opportunity to meet with District Advancement Chairmen discussing Eagle Scout Service Projects and the Eagle Application. When working on Scouting's highest award – no shortcuts will be taken during camp. Be Prepared. Parents are invited to the closing banquet on Friday night to celebrate the Scouts' accomplishments.

Bike Camp - Spend a week touring Long Island's East End by bicycle. Complete several rides toward the cycling merit badge. Visit Montauk Point and ride across Shelter Island.

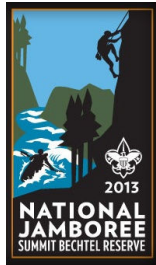

The Summit Bechtel Reserve is the newest high-adventure base in Scouting. It is the permanent home of the National Scout Jamboree, and the site of the 2019 World Scout Jamboree. Through outdoor action sports and experiential learning programs at world-class facilities, the Summit fosters achievement, adventure, and innovation in Scouting.

The Summit property is on 10,600 acres adjacent to the New River Gorge National River area in West Virginia. This area provides access to incredible outdoor terrain in the Appalachian Mountains, which includes some of the world's best whitewater rafting, rock climbing and mountain biking.



Philmont Scout Ranch

Is located in the Sangre De Cristo mountains of northern New Mexico. Over 30 staffed program camps that Scouts and Venturers take part in, including backpacking treks, horseback cavalcades, living history programs, fly fishing, mountain biking, conservation, astronomy and rock climbing.



Florida Sea Base

Has three sites in the Florida Keys, with a satellite location in the Bahamas. A variety of water activities including SCUBA, sailing, snorkeling, and fishing are offered.
